


2. Sessions

2.1. Self-determination movements in the European neighbourhood

- October 14th, Sala de Reuniões, 9.30 – 11.00
- PhD student Doctor Diana Bulcão
- Summary:

As a central topic on world politics, the question of self-determination has become increasingly relevant in the global arena. The United Nations Charter stipulates the aim to develop friendly relations among nations based on respect for the principle of equal rights and self-determination of peoples, but in later years appropriate measures to strengthen universal peace (Article 1(2)) establish a different perspective. However, the question of self-determination is still a matter of political contention, and some political communities who entered international recognition through self-determination (such as Israel, East Timor, Kosovo, etc.) have not been able to establish a stable (democratic) political system. For instance, the political developments in the Middle East have led to a 'yearning' for self-determination, and the whole of the world is still in a state of flux.

The growing self-determination movements in the European neighbourhood (such as Catalonia, Crimea and South Ossetia) has become a topic of increasing interest. The European Union (EU) has been reluctant and in some cases hostile to self-determination movements and the stability of international recognition, engagement without recognition etc.) they provide to the international community. The EU's selective application of the principle of self-determination remains puzzling.

This lecture aims to introduce students to concepts and approaches related to self-determination and their application in order to make informed decisions about it.

- Why do some nations seek international recognition as an independent state while others remain within the boundaries of another state?
- How do the international community and the European Union approach the issue of self-determination? Why are some states treated differently?
- Which theoretical approaches can be employed to explain the selective approach of the EU towards self-determination?
- Which research methods are useful to investigate the topic of self-determination?

At the end of the lecture, the participants will (1) have a critical understanding of the self-determination movements in the world in general and in the European neighbourhood in particular; (2) will be more familiar with the legal and sociological tools available to researchers of self-determination; and (3) will be better equipped to apply conceptual and theoretical approaches to different, real-world examples.

2.2. Self-determination movements in the European neighbourhood – reality or ideal?

- October 14th, Sala de Reuniões, 11.30 – 13.00
- PhD student Doctor Diana Bulcão
- Summary:

This seminar is an interactive session that gives participants the opportunity to engage in European neighbourhood cases of self-determination. In addition to sharing their own international experiences, the participants will learn by doing through role-playing exercises that give the opportunity to test upon the stance of a contested state, a state, the international community and the European Union.

The key aim of the seminar is to ensure that key concepts and problems related to self-determination are clearly understood and applied to different international cases. Hence, the participants will be able to apply theoretical and practical knowledge they acquire during the lecture to contemporary cases of self-determination, and to develop their own perspectives while contributing to group discussion, and to develop their knowledge on the growing debate about self-determination, its ambiguity and its recognition in Political Science and International Relations through its theoretical and practical dimensions.

The seminar will be an interactive one (1) by introducing the main problems and objectives of the seminar, (2) help from role-playing with the cases, (3) allowing different cases and cases to groups and individuals, and (4) leading the group and class discussions by raising specific and general questions.

The seminar will use audio-visual materials and handbooks.

2.3. EDP 15th. Sub de Rómulo. 9:30 - 11:00

- Professor Doctor Christian Knaul
- Summary:

The lecture will look at the nature of international security and at the specific place for Europe as an actor in international security. It will look specifically at the role of international security from a historical perspective, as well as empirical analysis of the 19th, 20th and 21st century. It will examine policy areas, such as terrorism and counter-terrorism, piracy, criminal justice, as well as cyber, migration and border policy, alongside more recent examples of international security, including global health.

2.4. Europe: Aesthetically perceptive

- Summary:

The lecture will look at a specific security study in Europe and will introduce participants to Rómulo's Europe's contribution to international security. The lecture will provide a historical security context, which can be illustrated by the slides.

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4. Procedures and deadlines

By applying, participants are acknowledging they are aware of all the procedures involved in their participation, including:

- Submitting a full paper (between 3000 and 4000 words)
- Reading the paper (pages they will have to correct on two and to ask questions to all the colleagues in their home groups - max. all participants per home group)
- Registering and paying the fee within the deadline
- Depending on the supervisor of the practical sessions, making extra materials

For the final presentation, participants will need to submit a full paper.

- 1-page document with basic information: Name, surname, affiliation, home phone number, working email address, etc.
- 1-page summary of the paper/article they will read, including clear references to the subject under study, objectives and methodological approach.
- Max. 2-page CV.
- Max. 1-page letter of motivation to participate in the Workshop.

Applicants who are selected to participate in the Workshop will be required to send:

- Full paper/article (between 3000 and 4000 words, including bibliography)
- Full Payment Proof
